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General Information

Geriatric care constitutes a significant portion, approximately 65%, of the healthcare provided in primary care. Given this substantial presence, it is crucial to equip healthcare providers with the necessary knowledge and skills to deliver appropriate care to older adults. In 2010, approximately 8% of the world's population was aged 65 years or over, and this percentage is projected to double, reaching 16%, by the year 2050. Lebanon has witnessed a rapid increase in its older population, making it one of the countries in the region with the highest proportion of older adults.

The evolving demographic landscape necessitates a transformation in medical care to meet the unique needs of the older population effectively. Primary care providers stand at the forefront of geriatric care, making it imperative for them to possess fundamental knowledge and skills in geriatric principles. This knowledge ensures the delivery of safe and effective care to our older adults.

With this context in mind, the workshop has been designed to empower primary care physicians and other healthcare professionals with the knowledge and skills required to recognize and address common issues and challenges faced by older adults. Each year, we focus on a specific theme related to geriatrics to ensure that participants are well-prepared to navigate the evolving landscape of senior healthcare. For this year's workshop, we have chosen to center our theme on neurological disorders in geriatrics, aligning our educational efforts with the changing healthcare needs of the aging population.

The Aim of the Workshop

To improve primary care physicians' knowledge, and skills in managing complex medical problems in older adults.

General Learning Objectives

- Demonstrate patient-centered communication and care approaches, showcasing their ability to engage older patients in shared decision-making, prioritize individual preferences, and create a healthcare experience that aligns with the values and goals of each patient.
- Diagnose and develop treatment plans for conditions like Alzheimer's disease,
 Parkinson's disease, and neuropathies but also address their comprehensive care,
 including psychosocial aspects and quality of life considerations.
- Identify and apply strategies for mindfulness, meditation, anxiety and depression management, obesity control, pain management, and optimize sleep quality, all of which contribute to enhanced overall health and well-being in older adults.
